The **Michener Museum in New Hope** at Union Square had its grand opening in November 2003 and celebrated the dreams and efforts of the many people dedicated to the project. Funding, both public and private, made the 5,000 square foot facility possible.

The Main Gallery features in-laid hardwood floors and coffered drywall ceilings. A specialized climate control system incorporates a HEPA (High Efficiency Particulate Air) filtration unit and steam humidification.



The Bucks County Interactive gallery, with its blackout walls and ceilings, provided the perfect showcase for the in-laid carpet illuminated by special lighting.



The gift shop comes alive with its unique pendant lighting fixtures. Circular "jet cut" limestone and porcelain tile patterns provide an attractive yet durable floor surface that leads visitors through the shop and into the galleries.
